WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment)

In the United Kingdom, the legislation regarding Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment has entered into force in January 2007. This legislation does affect all electrical and electronic appliances that are disposed of. From 2007 on, all discarded electrical and electronic equipment needs to be collected and recycled in an environmentally sound way. This is a joint obligation of both the producer and client.



All electric and electronic equipment is to be labelled with the symbol displayed on the left (crossed out wheel-bin with the black bar underneath) from January 2, 2007 on. In this way, it is indicated that these products need to be recycled separately. All FP International products sold after January 2, 2007 are labelled with this symbol.



In order to comply with the obligations regarding the environmentally sound disposal and recycling, FP International UK has agreed to a contract with the specialised electric and electronic equipment recycler Valpak (www.valpak.co.uk). All collected equipment and appliances will be recycled according to the environmental requirements set by law. The recovered material will be used as the basis for the production of new materials.

The following rules apply, according to paragraph X of the sales terms:

1. Upon sale of a new appliance, the old one will be taken back free of charge; or
2. In case an appliance turns out to be beyond repair, the equipment will be taken back free of charge by our mechanic; or
3. in all other cases, you are obliged, by law and within the sales terms, to return your waste or other disposed of products to: FP International Boundary Road, Brackley, Northants, NN13 7ES

The latter is not applicable if you decide to re-use the product.
